For Voters

1. Vote on election day, in person. IF this isn't possible, still vote but only use mail-in or early voting if there is no other way.
2. Take election day off and offer to drive conservative friends to the polls. Particularly older folks that might have a harder time.
3. IF you cannot do the above, make phone calls on election day to as many conservative friends as you can. If you have no conservative friends, contact your county Republican party HQ and see if they will give you a call list.
4. Don't use a sharpie to mark your votes if they offer you one.
5. If you show up and are told you already voted, call your local police and sheriff and report identity theft. Do it right away. Be loud.
6. Consider yourself an observer from the time you arrive to the time you leave. Note and report anything you see that seems odd or out of order.

For Election Workers/Volunteers

1. Do your homework. Know your job and the job of the other workers. Bring printouts of any documentation you have outlining what your job entails, including where you are allowed to be and what you are allowed to see.
2. If you are asked to do anything that goes against the above, do not comply. Be polite but firm. If you are asked to move from an area that you are supposed to be in, stand your ground. If efforts are made to hide something from your view that you are supposed to see, stop them. Make them call the cops to drag you out. Even better, you call them first.
3. For those involved in observing or helping with central counting, do not fall for the “we’re sending everyone home” or “we have a water leak” nonsense. If they tell you they are stopping for the night and you need to go home, be the last one out of the building. Stick around outside for a while to make sure nobody sneaks back into the building.
4. There is no “that’s good enough” in this election. Insist that everything be done to the exact letter of the law.

For County Election Clerks and Workers

1. If you are a patriotic American who wants a fair election, approach the election expecting people to try to cheat it. Whether you believe it or not, there was rampant fraud in 2020

and most election personnel were completely oblivious to it.

2. Increase your watchfulness for unauthorized people in the general area of any election hardware. Scan the street or sidewalks outside of the buildings for people who are not moving around much but are paying inordinate attention to their phone, tablet, or laptop. This includes people sitting in cars. Anything within about 6,000 square feet is potentially a target.
3. Please do not let representatives of the voting system companies run anything that you and your people can handle. They might offer to take care of some things for you out of the goodness of their hearts – say thanks, but no thanks. Keep control of your election.

For Everyone

1. Know your local laws regarding how far “electioneering” has to be from the polls. Watch for violations and report.
2. Watch for and immediately those who will attempt to intimidate voters into not voting, or worse, voting a certain way.
